**Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Weekend of October 11/12, 2014** – There are certain Bible verses Christian stewards have memorized. One of them is in Saint Paul's letter to the Philippines found in today's second reading—"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (4:13). Most people define themselves either by their problems or their possibilities. Fearful people wake up each morning ensnared by their problems. Christian stewards wake up reflecting on their possibilities with confidence and hope. Some stewardship reflection questions for the week: What challenges do you back away from because you doubt that you are up to them? What would you attempt tomorrow if you were sure God would help you?

Flowers may be planted on lots if the monuments have been placed. These may be planted on the face side of the monuments and must run the entire length of the monument, and a width of not more than ten inches.
