**St. Luke Cemetery:** Artificial decorations need to be removed, so maintenance may be done. They are permitted during the winter, from November 1 through March 1. Potted plants are permitted for Easter, Mothers' Day, Fathers' Day, Memorial Day, and Cemetery Sunday. They may be left for a period of ten days. Flowers may be planted on lots if the monuments have been placed. These may be planted on the face side of the monuments and must run the entire length of the monument, and a width of not more than ten inches. The Cemetery is not responsible for the weeding, watering, etc. of planted flowers. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping St. Luke Cemetery a pleasant burial location.

**St. Vincent de Paul School Kindergarten Screenings for 2015-16:** Students are scheduled for Thursday, April 9 and Friday, April 10 from 8:30 until 2:00. Children must be 5 years old by September 1<sup>st</sup> to be eligible for Kindergarten. Please call the school office at 740/393-3611 to schedule a screening. There are income based Scholarships available for Kindergarten through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade.

**Women's Health screenings, April 10 at Sanctuary Service Center....Diagnostic Medical X-ray and Imaging** – Mobile Mammogram Unit from Boardman, Ohio will be at the Sanctuary Service Center from 8am to 2pm. They accept Medicare, Medicaid, Insurance and private pay (\$122.50). If you do not have insurance, you may qualify for assistance from Region 5 Breast and Cervical Cancer project. The mobile does not require a doctor's order but your insurance may. Be sure to check with your insurance to verify coverage. The screening is the current digital mammogram that is recommended by the medical profession.

**Pap and Clinical Breast exams, KnoHoCo Women's Health with nurse practitioner, Patti Sprang** will be available from 8:30 to 12 noon. Insurance, Region 5 Project and United Way funding and private pay (\$40). Both screenings are open to all ladies. **Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 21-22** – The climactic event of Jesus’ passion and death is drawing closer; a time when the great confrontation between Jesus and the powers of darkness take place. Jesus invites his disciples into a great mystery with curious pronouncements: Those who love their lives just as they are will lose them. If a grain of wheat dies, it will bear much fruit. When Jesus is lifted up, he will draw all to himself. The Christian steward knows life can’t be lived in complacency. We are called to die to self, bear more fruit, be raised up with Jesus. In today’s Gospel reading Jesus brings discomfort to those who are comfortable. Jesus urges us to step out of our “comfort zone.” How will we respond to Jesus?

**Rice Bowl Reflections – Week 5, March 22 – Call to Family, Community and Participation:** Human beings are social by nature. We, like the early disciples, are called to come together as a community whether that community is our classroom, workplace or family.

- God makes covenants with groups of people—entire communities—and he keeps his promises. *What does this say about God? What does this say about how we, in community, relate to God?*
- Jesus recognizes that he has arrived at a difficult point in his life for the sake of glorifying God. He commits to doing God’s will, no matter the cost. *Do we offer our suffering up for the glory of God? Do we help others work through their own difficulties for God’s greater glory?*
- This week’s CRS Rice Bowl Story of Hope takes us to the Democratic Republic of Congo, where we meet a community that comes together to improve their harvests. *Do we see God in new ways when we come together as a community? How does God speak through others?*

**Danville Branch Interchurch Social Services special collection, March 28-29**...Next weekend there will be a second collection for Danville Interchurch Social services. Danville Interchurch is a branch of the county Interchurch organization. Danville’s manager is Sue Wadian. The Danville Branch opened in July 1995 at the request of ADAM (Association of Danville Area Ministers). In 2011, they moved into their newly constructed facility at 304 ½ Market Street. Interchurch manages a thrift shop with donations of clothing, bedding, housewares, shoes, boots, coats, etc. accepted Monday through Wednesday 10am to 3pm. (No furniture, appliances, computers, or televisions are accepted.) Danville Interchurch is funded by donations, thrift shop sales, Christmas in July fund drive, and the Food for the Hungry drive in December. Danville Interchurch assists families in East Knox and Danville School districts needing food (once a month), clothing, utility assistance (maximum 2 times a year), transportation funding & nominal medical financial assistance.
