Palm Sunday of the Lord’s Passion, March 28 & 29 – This weekend we participate in the proclamation of the passion and death of Jesus according to the Gospel of Mark. We are witnesses to Jesus’ undeterred obedience to the Father which comes at great sacrifice. An important part of Christian stewardship is the willingness to make sacrifices that reveal our own embrace of Jesus’ cross. Over the next three days of this most Holy Week, reflect on this question: As good stewards of our life in Christ, what concrete sacrifices are we willing to make to witness God’s love to the world?

Rice Bowl Reflections – Week 6, Palm Sunday: The Common Good – As God’s family, we are all called to look out for one another. It’s not just about “me.” It’s about “us.” How can we be sure that the decisions we make in our own community and in the world help build up and protect God’s entire family?

- Isaiah reminds us that God gives us a “well-trained tongue... to answer the weary a word that will waken them.” *Do we listen to God’s Spirit within us? How does the Spirit motivate us and guide our words as we work for a more just world?*
- Jesus “emptied himself, taking the form of a slave.” *How are we called, especially during Lent, to empty ourselves for the good of others?*
- This week’s CRS Rice Bowl Story of Hope takes us to a community in the United States, in the Diocese of Albany. *How have our Lenten reflections on Global solidarity affected how we view poor and vulnerable people in our own communities?*

Cemetery Caretaker Needed: St. Luke Parish is looking for a caretaker for St. Luke Cemetery, located at 15355 Howard-Danville Rd. The job includes grass cutting, trimming, and removal of trash during the grass-growing season. It also includes contacting and meeting with the person who digs the graves, locating and marking the grave and sod replacement. In addition, it would include digging for the burial of cremated remains. A prospective applicant would be employed by the parish or a self-employed contractor with Workers Compensation insurance. If employed, Workers Compensation would be paid by the church. All employees must go to a Protecting God’s Children seminar and have a Criminal Background check. The caretaker would be paid by the hour and if he/she provided the equipment (mowers, etc.) an hourly rental would be paid as well. **St. Luke’s is also seeking an individual to dig graves.** Please call the parish office if you are interested.
