Cemetery Caretaker Needed: St. Luke Parish is looking for a caretaker for St. Luke Cemetery, located at 15355 Howard-Danville Rd. The job includes grass cutting, trimming, and removal of trash during the grass-growing season. It also includes contacting and meeting with the person who digs the graves, locating and marking the grave and sod replacement. In addition, it would include digging for the burial of cremated remains. A prospective applicant would be employed by the parish or a self-employed contractor with Workers Compensation insurance. If employed, Workers Compensation would be paid by the church. All employees must go to a Protecting God's Children seminar and have a Criminal Background check. The caretaker would be paid by the hour and if he/she provided the equipment (mowers, etc.) an hourly rental would be paid as well. **St. Luke's is also seeking an individual to dig graves.** Please call the parish office if you are interested.
