**Nepal Earthquake Update:** Catholic Relief Services is committing at least \$10 million to help those affected by the devastating 7.8-magnitude earthquake in Nepal. These funds will be used to support CRS' emergency response and recovery efforts, including immediate life-saving assistance as well as a long-term response needed to rebuild communities & livelihoods. CRS plans to spend \$2.5 million in the emergency phase, the next six months. That will reach 15,000 families – 75,000 people – with shelter and other critical supplies. The balance of the funding will be used to help families restore their livelihoods and rebuild their homes. The official death toll is over 8,000. The most effective means of assistance is through our prayers and donations to CRS.
