Baptism Preparation: In preparation for infant baptism, parents are required to attend a meeting along with their Godparents, if possible. There are forms to complete for the parents & godparents on the St. Vincent website and then you may contact Greg Henkel at gregmhenkel@gmail.com or 740-397-4711 x5 to set up a meeting.

Selecting Godparents for your child: A Godparent needs to have an appreciation of the Catholic faith, a practice of the same, and a sense of responsibility toward the child and parents. Church law requires a sponsor/godparent to be at least 16 years of age, fully initiated (Confirmed), and be a registered and participating Catholic at a Catholic parish. While it is a common practice to have two sponsors/godparents, only one is required for Baptism. Along with the Catholic sponsor/godparent, a person in good standing in a Christian church may serve as a Christian Witness for the child.
