Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Weekend of August 1/2, 2015 – In today’s Gospel we hear Jesus proclaiming that he is “the bread of life.” He then offers an invitation to come to him. St. Luke Cemetery Prices: Due to increased burial costs, the prices at St. Luke Cemetery have increased. The price of a gravesite is now \$400 and the burial fee is \$600. Besides the need to cover the higher burial expense, we must generate enough funds to pay for the upkeep of the cemetery. We have an annual collection for the cemetery in October, but it does not come close to covering the costs of maintenance. The gravesites of our loved ones buried at St. Luke Cemetery require perpetual care. St. Luke Cemetery accounts are separate from the parish operating accounts.

Membership at St. Luke Parish: If you have been attending Mass at St. Luke but have not officially become a member, it’s easy to do! Just fill out a registration form with your information. We will send it to the Diocese of Columbus. If you are currently a member of another parish in the diocese, they will transfer your membership to St. Luke’s. (You cannot be a member of two parishes at once.) Family Registration Forms are available in the parish office and on the tables in church, or one can be mailed to you if requested.
