**Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Weekend of September 19/20, 2015** – In today's Gospel, Jesus continues to turn society's idea of greatness upside down. He teaches that true greatness lies in being a servant to others; a good steward of our relationships. We want success, but Jesus defines success differently than we do. Jesus redefines our notions of greatness and success. How do we define success? Is our notion of success consistent with the teachings of Jesus Christ?
