Register to be an organ and tissue donor today! Organ, eye and tissue donation is a true act of charity and love, which are major tenets of Christianity. In fact, all major religions – including Roman Catholicism – support it.

The truth about organ, eye and tissue donation:

- If you are taken to the hospital after an accident or injury, it is the hospital's number one priority to save YOUR life. Organ and tissue donation is not an option until death occurs.
- Your age and medical history should not prevent you from joining the Ohio Donor Registry. At the time of death, medical tests will determine what organs, eyes and/or tissues are healthy enough for transplant.
- If an open casket funeral was possible before donation, those plans should not be altered.
- If you decide to be an organ and tissue donor your family will NOT have to pay for the medical expenses associated with the donation.
- Organs are allocated based on factors like severity of illness, blood type, body size and length of time on the list. An individual's wealth or social status plays no role in the decision.
- You can sign up to be an organ or tissue donor in any of the following ways:
 -Say "yes" when you visit the BMV office to renew or receive your driver license or state Identification card;
 -Go online to www.lifelineofohio.org (you will need a valid Ohio's driver license or state identification card);
 -Fill out and mail in a Donor Registry Enrollment Form.

Weekend of November 14-15, Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time – How would you spend your day if you knew it was the last day you would spend on earth? Undoubtedly, it would not be a normal day. The point of today's Gospel reading is that the end-time is always imminent. The good steward remains prayerfully alert, ready to give an accounting; and living each day in the awareness of the coming judgment and salvation. How do we exercise stewardship over our daily lives? Are we prepared to give an accounting? How will we allow Christ to work in and through us to prepare for the reconciliation of the heavens and the earth?
