Cemetery Flower Rules & Regulations

Flower Beds: Flowers may be planted on cemetery lots if the monuments have been placed. These may be placed on the face side of the monument and must run the entire length of the monument and a width of not more than ten inches. The Cemetery is not responsible for flowers.

Potted Flowers: Potted plants are permitted for Easter, Mother’s Day, Father’s Day, Memorial Day and Cemetery Sunday. They may be left for a period of ten days.

Artificial Flowers or Wreaths: Artificial decorations are permitted during the winter from November 1st to March 1st. Regulations do not permit any artificial flowers or decorations from March 1 to November 1. **They must be removed before the mowing season.**

These regulations are for the welfare of St. Luke Cemetery. Your cooperation in observing them will not only beautify the grave(s) of your loved ones, but will keep the Cemetery an attractive burial place for all.

A Stewardship Moment: Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday), Weekend of April 2/3, 2016

In today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we hear it proclaimed that many "signs and wonders" were performed in public by Christ's followers, a demonstration that produced two results. First, the people of Jerusalem outside the Christian community were awed by what the disciples were performing. And in the midst of all this amazement, many were being converted. Good stewards know of the evangelizing power emanating from their daily acts of love, compassion, mercy and generosity. They believe that if they stay focused on Christ each day, every act has the power to transform a broken world. What "signs and wonders" will we perform today?
