He Makes Himself a Gift: This evening [Solemnity of Corpus Christi], once again, the Lord distributes for us the bread that is his Body; he makes himself a gift, and we, too, experience “God's solidarity” with man, a solidarity that is never depleted, a solidarity that never ceases to amaze us. God makes himself close to us; in the sacrifice of the cross, he humbles himself, entering the darkness of death to give us his life, which overcomes evil, selfishness, and death. Jesus, this evening too, gives himself to us in the Eucharist, shares in our journey; indeed, he makes himself food, the true food which sustains our life also in moments when the road becomes hard going and obstacles slow our steps. And in the Eucharist, the Lord makes us walk on his road, that of service, of sharing, of giving; and if it is shared, that little we have, that little we are, becomes riches, for the power of God—which is the power of love—comes down into our poverty to transform it.

So let us ask ourselves this evening, in adoring Christ who is really present in the Eucharist: do I let myself be transformed by him? Do I let the Lord who gives himself to me guide me to going out ever more from my little enclosure, in order to give, to share, to love him and others?

A Stewardship Moment: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Weekend of May 28/29 – From the rich Eucharistic themes to be drawn from today's second reading, one stewardship theme stands out: the Eucharist is Christ's gift to us. Good stewards are grateful for this gift and realize that no matter their station in life, they are welcome to come to the table and receive the body and blood of Christ. If Jesus could break bread with his betrayer, Judas, his denier, Peter, and the other ten who deserted him, then he will welcome us. Do we truly appreciate what a tremendous gift it is to approach the Lord's table? Do we accept the transforming power of the gift of Christ's body and blood?

The Bishop's Annual Appeal continues. We have received Pledges of \$31,185 so far. We are over the goal but less than half of parishioners have made a pledge. Money collected over our goal will be returned to St. Luke's to be used for our needs. Please prayerfully consider a gift for this year's Appeal. If you have not given in the past, we hope you will consider doing so. All gifts are appreciated.

Confirmation Practice: We will have a Confirmation practice on Tuesday June 7 at 7:00 pm. The sponsors should be there also. If the sponsor is not able to be there please find a stand-in for the practice so they can relay the instructions to the sponsor for the real Confirmation ceremony the next night.

Young Adults: At age 23 you MUST register under your own name! Being a registered member makes it easier to be married, to have an infant baptized, even for a funeral. If you are asked to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, the parish will be asked to provide confirmation of membership at the Parish and we need to see that you are a registered, active, contributing member of St. Luke's.

To register at St. Luke Parish, please pick up a Family Registration form in the church from the table near the side entrance or in the vestibule or one can be mailed to you upon request. Just fill it out with your information and return it to the parish office. We will send it to the Diocese of Columbus. If you are currently a member of another parish in the diocese, the diocese will transfer your membership to St. Luke's. (You cannot be a member of two parishes at once.)

Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Consolation Basilica and National Shrine: The Holy Door at the Shrine is open to the faithful to access throughout the Year of Mercy. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, passing through a Holy Door is part of the pilgrimage that all Catholics are encouraged to make, whether during a trip to Rome, a trip to the cathedrals or to specially designated churches in their own diocese. These pilgrimages come with special graces, and they allow each of us to share in the many blessings of the Holy Year. In addition, Pope Francis has announced that Catholics will have the opportunity to obtain plenary indulgence in the Year of Mercy.

Traditionally, the conditions to receive indulgences are: *Experiencing the Sacrament of Reconciliation; receiving Holy Communion; praying for the Pope; a rejection of all attachment to sin; and a passage through a Holy Door or performing one of the Corporal or Spiritual works of Mercy.*
