### **Jubilee Year of Mercy**

The following are excerpts from the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, known as the "Apostle of The Divine Mercy" (#302 & 1588) St. Faustina heard the Lord speak to her these words:

*Proclaim that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. All the works of My hands are crowned with mercy. I do not want to punish aching mankind but I desire to heal it, pressing it to My Merciful Heart. I use punishment when they themselves force Me to do so; My hand is reluctant to take hold of the sword of justice. Before the Day of Justice I am sending the Day of Mercy.*

**God Always Thinks with Mercy** – God always thinks with mercy: do not forget this. God always thinks mercifully. He is the merciful Father! God thinks like the father waiting for the son and goes to meet him; he spots him coming when he is still far off [Luke 15:11-32]...

What does this mean? That he went every day to see if his son was coming home: this is our merciful Father. It indicates that he was waiting for him with longing on the terrace of his house.
