Conscience Protection Legislation. The USCCB is supporting the Conscience Protection Act of 2016 (S. 304) to be included in this year's must-pass appropriations package. The U.S. House passed the measure in July 2016 with a bipartisan vote. This legislation makes it clearer sponsors or providers of health plans who do not include elective abortion cannot be discriminated against. The CPA protects health care providers from being forced to pay for or participate in abortions and allows victims of discrimination a "right of action" to defend themselves in court. Government should not force hospitals, doctors, nurses, and other providers to stop offering much-needed health care because they cannot in good conscience participate in destroying human life. Stewardship Moment: Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Weekend of September 24-25, 2016

In today's gospel Jesus offers a warning about living selfishly in his parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. The Rich Man holds sumptuous feasts and dresses in fine clothes. But despite his affluence he does nothing to relieve the painful hunger and debilitating condition of his neighbor Lazarus. He neglects to love his neighbor as he loves himself and is sent to hell for his lifestyle and desire for self-gratification. The Rich Man represents those who spend their money on their own personal pleasures with no regard for sharing their material possessions with the poor and needy in their own neighborhood. Good stewards realize the practical implications of not only loving God, but loving their neighbor as they would love themselves. Who are the less fortunate in our neighborhood? Do we share a portion of our own blessings with them?

Life has its storms – Stressful relationships, jobs, poor health; situations where we feel our powerlessness.
