Baptism Preparation: Parents are required to attend a meeting along with their Godparents, if possible. There are forms to complete for the parents & godparents on the St. Vincent website and then you may contact Greg Henkel at gregmhenkel@gmail.com or 740-392-4711 ext. 5 to set up a meeting.

Selecting Godparents for your child: A godparent should have a sense of responsibility toward the child and parents. Church law requires a sponsor/godparent be at least 16 years of age, fully initiated (Confirmed), and be a registered and participating Catholic at a Catholic parish. They must be attending Mass weekly and be registered at the parish where they attend. (Young adult children are generally left on their parents' registration for a few years after they graduate from high school. After that they need to register at the local parish where they attend Mass.) While it is a common practice to have two sponsors/godparents, only one is required for Baptism. Along with the Catholic sponsor/godparent, a person in good standing in a Christian church may serve as a Christian Witness for the child.

Helping Her Children Grow Strong – A mother helps her children grow up and wants them to grow strong; that is why she teaches them not to be lazy—which can also drive from a certain kind of well-being; not to sink into a comfortable lifestyle, contenting oneself with possessions. The mother takes care that her children develop better, that they grow strong, capable of accepting responsibilities, of engaging in life, of striving for great ideals. The Gospel of St. Luke tells us that in the family of Nazareth, Jesus "grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him (2:40). Our Lady does just this for us; she helps us to grow as human beings and in the faith, to be strong and never to fall into the temptation of being human beings and Christians in a superficial way, but to live responsibly, to strive ever higher.
