Bi-Monthly Healing Mass on July 17 at Saint Joseph Cathedral: A Mass of Healing and Healing Service will be celebrated on Monday, July 17, 6:30 p.m. at Saint Joseph Cathedral, 212 East Broad Street, Columbus. Following the Mass, a Service of Healing will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of relic of the True Cross of Christ, followed by an opportunity for each person to speak individually with a priest and receive prayers of healing for what they seek; the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Service of Healing will close with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g. cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), in addition to those who seek emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited as well. Parking is available at the rear of the Cathedral accessible off East Gay Street; handicap accessible elevator is located in the courtyard (west side of the Cathedral) on East Broad Street. Baptism Preparation: Parents are required to attend a meeting along with their Godparents, if possible. There are forms to complete for the parents & godparents on the St. Vincent website and then you may contact Greg Henkel at gregmhenkel@gmail.com or 740-397-4711 x5 to set up a meeting.

Selecting Godparents for your child: A godparent should have a sense of responsibility toward the child and parents. Church law requires a sponsor/godparent be at least 16 years of age, fully initiated (Confirmed), and be a registered and participating Catholic at a Catholic parish. They must be attending Mass weekly and be registered at the parish where they attend. (Young adult children are generally left on their parents' registration for a few years after they graduate from high school. After that they need to register at the local parish where they attend Mass.) While it is a common practice to have two sponsors/godparents, only one is required for Baptism. Along with the Catholic sponsor/godparent, a person in good standing in a Christian church may serve as a Christian Witness for the child.

Do you own a Smart Phone? If you do, consider adding a free app, "**Laudate**". It contains over 200 Catholic Prayers, Liturgy of the Hours, Podcasts of Mass Readings, Audible Rosary, Chaplet, Stations of the Cross, Bible, Catechism, Vatican Documents, Catholic Media and more. Take advantage of this tremendous Resource and grow in your faith!

A Perfect Family Does Not Exist – More than anywhere else, the family is where we daily experience our own limits and those of others, the problems great and small entailed in living peacefully with others.
