Hurricane Harvey collection – September 9 & 10: Parishes of the diocese of Columbus will collect funds to be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and other Catholic agencies as they reach out to provide humanitarian aid in Texas and other affected parts of the Gulf Coast region. Cash donations offer the most flexibility to address urgently developing needs. With cash in hand, needed resources can be obtained nearer to the disaster location. This inflow of cash also pumps money back into the local economy and helps local businesses recover faster. When items are donated, the helping agencies must redirect their staff away from providing direct services to survivors to sort, package, transport, warehouse, distribute, and discard items that may not meet the needs of disaster survivors. Unexpected volunteers create an additional burden for first responders. At this time, volunteers are asked to register with an organization of their choice, many of which are already in Texas and supporting survivors on the ground.

Sanctuary Hot Meal special collection this weekend.....Sanctuary's Hot meal program delivers an average of 75 meals to seniors Monday through Friday. The service area is East Knox and Danville school districts--to Holmes, Ashland & Licking county lines. There are 6 delivery routes with 30 individuals taking a turn (many from St. Luke's) delivering the meals. Primary funding for the meal program is from the county-wide senior services levy. However, funding is reduced from previous years despite the increase in service. Meals are prepared in the licensed kitchen of Danville Methodist Church by Sanctuary Community Action's hot meal staff. This weekend's collection will go entirely to the hot meal program. Please use the envelope in your September packet marked 'Sanctuary' or place your donation (cash or check) in an envelope and mark it Sanctuary. You may make check payable to SCA Hot Meals or St. Luke with a memo for Sanctuary. Your contribution is tax deductible and sincerely appreciated. (Note: loose change or check not placed in a marked envelope will not reach the meal program)
