Catholic Response to the 500th Anniversary of the Beginning of the Protestant Reformations:

On Monday, October 30, Jim Anderson, who works with Marcus Grodi at the Coming Home Network headquartered in Zanesville, Ohio, will speak on the 500th Anniversary of the publishing of the “95 Theses” by Fr. Martin Luther, on October 31, 1517 which sparked the beginning of the Protestant Reformations. Jim lived in Fulda, Germany in 2012 for 11 months while researching this topic. Jim will discuss for the average person some of the causes of the Protestant Reformations and the corresponding response of the Catholic reformation, the life of Martin Luther and some of the reasons he wrote his Theses, and the effects of the Protestant Reformations down through history up to now to both Catholics as well as Protestants. The talk will begin at 6:30 pm followed by a question and answer session at 8pm. The talk will be held in St Vincent de Paul Catholic Church. The entire community is welcome to attend.
