As you know Parish Safety continues to be an ongoing priority. I ask that the ushers please continue to lock the doors at the side and back of the Church. In addition, please ensure that the Sacristy door is also locked. The doors should be locked at the beginning of the First Reading. I also ask that if our children need to visit the restroom during Mass that they be escorted by an adult. There has been input from Parishioners requesting that we install a way that would make entry/re-entry into the Church easy after the doors are locked. We have installed a silent strobe light activated by pushing an outside doorbell button. There is one on the center glass door in the back and one on the side door. 1st Saturday Fatima Devotions with Fr. The Confession may be made during the eight days preceding or following the first Saturday of each month, provided that Holy Communion be received in the state of grace. Should one forget to form the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, it may be formed at the next Confession, occasion to go to confession being taken at the first opportunity."* Our Lady promised we would obtain *"at the hour of death the graces necessary for salvation."* Fr. Olvera will hear confessions immediately after Mass. All Masses will begin at 8:30am. Next one will be on Saturday, May 5th. Please join us!

<p>Catechism of the Catholic Church 644: Even when faced with the reality of the risen Jesus the disciples are still doubtful, so impossible did the thing seem: they thought they were seeing a ghost. "In their joy they were still disbelieving and still wondering." Thomas will also experience the test of doubt and St. Matthew relates that during the risen Lord's last appearance in Galilee "some doubted." Therefore the hypothesis that the Resurrection was produced by the apostles' faith (or credulity) will not hold up. On the contrary their faith in the Resurrection was born, under the action of divine grace, from their direct experience of the reality of the risen Jesus.</p>
