Rhoda Wise House pilgrimage: Fr. Olvera will be leading a pilgrimage to the Rhoda Wise house in Canton, Ohio on July 7th. Rhoda Wise is a *Servant of God*, which means she is being investigated for sainthood. EWTN foundress, Mother Angelica, attributes Rhoda for getting her started on the path toward the religious life. We will meet at St. Luke's at 7am, leave on a coach by 7:30am, and return by 6:00pm. We will celebrate the 70th anniversary of her death with Mass at St. Peter's in Canton, followed by lunch, a visit to Mother Angelica's first monastery, then a visit to the Rhoda Wise house. There will be hundreds of pilgrims that day, so be prepared. The 55 bus seats will be available on a first come, first serve basis. The total cost for the trip, including lunch, will be \$30. Catechism of the Catholic Church 523: *St. John the Baptist* is the Lord's immediate precursor or forerunner, sent to prepare his way. He inaugurates the Gospel, already from his mother's womb welcomes the coming of Christ, and rejoices in being "the friend of the bridegroom," whom he points out as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." Going before Jesus "in the spirit and power of Elijah," John bears witness to Christ in his preaching, by his Baptism of conversion, and through his martyrdom.
